Roman Assembly

As you will be aware, we are currently practising for our class assembly based around the Romans. Your child has been given their part and we are asking for your support with their costumes. The style of costume needed is dependent upon their role but most are relatively simple. For the roles of: facts, any extra information, or anyone who addresses the audience directly, a pale, plain t-shirt and trousers or a skirt will suffice. If your child has the role of a slave, an old pale t-shirt or a pillow case would be great, possibly with shorts underneath. This could be a little muddy or grey and tied with rope to demonstrate the lack of comfort in their clothing. For the role of soldier/centurion, the focus of their costume will be their shields (we are hoping to use some of the wonderful shields which were created for homework so we'd be grateful for the use of any which may have been brought back home to you.) If you are able to provide a helmet or some form of brown tunic, it would be appreciated although we would like to stress to we are not expecting you to spend huge amounts of money on this costume.

If you have any costumes which are suitable for a role in the play and you are willing to lend them to another child, we would be extremely grateful.

The assembly will be performed to parents/guardians on Thursday 17th March at 3pm. We expect it to last approximately half an hour and you will then be able to take your child home with you after the performance has ended, if you are able to make it.

If family members intend to come to our performance, please could you give us a rough estimate of how many people will be attending, this will allow us to hopefully set out enough chairs for everyone, although we do ask for a maximum of 3.
