



## Primary PE & Sport Premium Impact Statement 2016\_17

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### 1. The purpose of this document

This document states how Chandlers Ridge Academy has planned and utilised the Primary PE & Sports Premium funding allocated for the academic year 2016\_17.

### 2. What is the Primary PE & Sports Premium?

The Primary PE & Sports Premium is funding paid directly to schools; it is awarded at a rate of £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil. At Chandlers Ridge the amount for the academic year 2016\_17 was **£9425**.

2.1 The premium is allocated in accordance with the Department for Education's (DfE) vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium as follows:

**ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport**

2.2 The premium is provided to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. The focus of spending at Chandlers Ridge will lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding. We have focussed much of our funding on the share and spread of PE Continuous Professional Development amongst all staff at Chandlers Ridge to help achieve this aim. This has resulted in our achievement of a Bronze level Active Mark.

2.3 The DfE expects that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

2.4 Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. At Chandlers Ridge we use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that we offer
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
