



Homework

In Year 3 and 4 we operate a homework system that hopefully you can fit around your busy home life. This is in addition to reading at least 3 times a week. We ask that over the half term you bring in one piece of homework each Monday and hand them to your classteacher. You can choose from the varied tasks below but ask that you complete 2 **maths** tasks, 2 **English** tasks and 2 'other' tasks in any order over the 6 weeks. We fully appreciate that some weekends are busier than others, but we hope that giving the whole half term's homework tasks, you can plan which one fits each weekend, or whenever you choose to do it. We expect that the children will present the homework as neatly they would present work in school to show that they are proud of their work, using a pencil if possible. We will be ordering a homework file for each of the Year 3s and any of the Year 4s that need another in the first week back so work can be transported to school easily.

Some tasks are rather open ended and are completely up to you how you present them, others have a sheet to complete.

We use 'MyMaths' as our Internet based maths homework provision. The children require individual login details and the tasks are set so that they are suited to each child's ability level. Log in details will be provided within the first 2 weeks back. There is a section that allows you to practice the skill and then set questions to answer. There are many tasks available and these will change every half term. You can choose as many or as few tasks as you wish for each maths homework. They work best on a computer, but if you wish to use a tablet there is an app that allows mymaths to run. Please contact your classteacher if you need assistance.

Finally, we recognise the time and effort that you at home put into homework. Children who have produced spectacular homework will get a certificate to bring home, which is also worth 2 housepoints. (This might not be the same day as it is handed in!) We don't return homework unless when we mark it, there have been many mistakes that we will feel will be beneficial for the child to have another go at. The 'mymaths' task are self-marking; we get a report of how long it took to do, when it was completed and the number of correct answers that we print out each week.





Beautiful work is displayed on our homework board in each of the 3 classrooms.
