Reading

In September the children will be issued with a new reading book and reading record. In the reading record there is a section for reading comments. It is important that an adult listens to your child read at least 3 times a week and signs their reading record. A reward system is in place for those children that read at least 3 times per week to an adult at home. They will receive a sticker and if they achieve this 10 times they will receive a prize!



Number Bonds

It is really important that your child knows and has quick recall of all their numbers bonds (pairs of numbers that make 10 and then 20). E.g. 1+9, 2+8 and so on. It is important that the children regularly practice these at home. They will also spend time in school working through these.



Spellings

The children will learn a combination of spelling patterns and words from the Y1 spelling list that they are expected to know. They will be tested on a Friday.



Homework

Homework will be issued on a half term basis. There will be a selection of activities to choose from each week. We expect three pieces of homework per half term to be **returned on a Wednesday**. Please return the homework grid also with your homework.
